Take Time To Reflect And Act

Does your parish community inform parents that they are responsible for their children's spiritual growth and development? Do parents, guardians, godparents, and sponsors know they are responsible? Does your parish have a plan in place to encourage and teach parents, guardians, godparents, and sponsors how to nurture their own spiritual growth and development so that they can fulfill their responsibilities to do the same for their children? If not, what initiatives can you design to educate parents about their responsibilities? How can your parish meet the spiritual needs of families? What initiatives can you propose to bring to your pastor and pastoral team?

Do your families understand their role in preparing their children for heaven? How might you compare their responsibility to prepare their children for life with their responsibility to prepare them for heaven? What could you do to help families understand that they are responsibility for preparing their children for heaven?

Why is it important to enhance the spiritual growth and development of parents and sponsors as part of the candidate's preparation for Confirmation? If you knew that you could use sacramental preparation to intentionally nurture the spiritual growth of your parishioners would you do it? Are you willing to make parent/sponsor retreats in preparation for Confirmation mandatory? Why or why not?

Confirmation must also become known as the sacrament of opportunity for parishes to assess how well they have done in ensuring that both parents and their children come to know Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. Confirmation must become known as the sacrament of opportunity for parishes to assess how well they have taught, mentored, and coached parents and sponsors to live in the Spirit and operate in the gifts and charisms of the Holy Spirit.



I will love my candidate unconditionally; be an example of how to draw closer to God by receiving the Sacraments regularly and by being faithful to prayer; encourage my candidate to live a Christian life after Confirmation; give my candidate advice as to how to grow in holiness; guide my candidate to learn about his/her faith, Scripture, and the teachings of the Church; share the joys and the struggles of my own faith journey with my candidate; help my candidate discern his/her gifts and find a way to use them in a specific parish ministry; support my candidate spiritually and emotionally should he/she turn away from God; pray "for" my candidate and pray "with" my candidate; and have on-going contact with my candidate throughout his/her life.
